






Popular Mechanics, A, m/5

Why is the person running? What is the person's relationship with what lies out of view? The short pants, the naked legs; what is the significance of the attire?














Soft Concrete Cooking by Marc Pira. 14.5x 2.12 mm, 36 ppg, xerox. A series of wonderfully dark xerox collages which deal with eroticism and symbolic functioning of celebs in that regard. My favorite part was the beginning where coarse halftones of Monroe (that symbol) are messed with & suggestive things happen, like lips for eyes. The series winds up much differently & some of the things I wonder if it wouldn't ve worked better if they were left out, but my reservations are slight, I enjoyed it a lot. Bordeaux Cedex France. Also look into <u>Voices</u> by Marc Pira. 40:00, stereo cassette. Rhythmic & throbby, certain repeated sounds become vocalic as you hear them more. Composition is augmentative: things are added as you go along to create a richer and headier mix. Some things get subtracted & you are left with something different than what you started out with. Other things are added to augment that. And so on. Available at above address.

A 'zine devoted specifically to reviews of this kind of work is MOCKreviewZ which I highly recommend. Zen Sutherland's reviews are as much about himself as they are about the work, but never mind it's good fun & actually informative. Lots of poetry work and copy art and mail art are reviewed here. 


